For Delhi patients at home, oxygen a call away: Kejriwal

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal announced on Monday that his government will give pulse oximeters to Covid-19 patients under home isolation and said the number of coronavirus tests has increased by three times in the national capital. The chief minister said till now, Delhi did not require beds for Covid-19 patients on a large scale as most of them recovered from the disease, adding that the number of serious patients is also less in the national capital.



He said the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government is getting "enough support" to arrest the spread of Covid-19 in Delhi.

"We will give pulse oximeters to the Covid-19 patients under home isolation. Every district will have oxygen concentrators. Delhi will soon have a helpline and our team will go to the houses of the patients who are recovering from the disease to provide oxygen," Kejriwal said.
